Summary

1. “Sometimes the patient waits for over a month to get the surgery done, sometimes the patient is air-lifted here and ready to have the surgery right away. Both cases abound.”
2. “We’ve done almost 70 cases so far this year. Around 70 for sure.”
3. “You don’t have to inquire about the donor liver sources. If you want to do the surgery, then don’t ask this kind of questions.”
4. The doctor refused to disclose information about liver donor sources.

Phone Investigation Recording

Doctor: Hello, how are you?

Investigator: Hello! How are you, doctor? I’m just wondering, there’s someone with liver cirrhosis, how long does he have to wait for a liver transplant surgery, if he registers in your hospital? Ballpark.

Doctor: We have designated people in charge of this matter, arranging this matter.

Investigator: Would you please let me know? I have to decide whether or not to register here depending on the wait time. If the wait time is too long, I won’t come. If short, then I might...

Doctor: What’s the patient’s blood type?

Investigator: Type B.

Doctor: How old is the patient?

Investigator: Over 50 years old.

Doctor: I can’t say much about the liver sources. I can’t guarantee you anything about when the liver source would show up. Sometimes the patient waits for over a month to get the surgery done, sometimes the patient is air-lifted here and ready to have the surgery right away. Both cases abound. I can’t give you a definite answer. You have to change. You have to consult the outside doctors, ‘cos you are talking about the liver donor sources.

Investigator: How many cases have you done so far this year? If you have done 10 cases, then I can figure out what my number would be.

Doctor: We've done almost 70 cases.

Investigator: Almost 70? You've done almost 70 cases so far this year?

Doctor: Yes, over 60 and approaching 70.

Investigator: Ok, ok, good, good.

Doctor: It could be over 70. I can't remember clearly now. Around 70 for sure.

Investigator: Oh, how about your donor liver sources? Do you find liver sources from outside of the hospital or you just wait for them?

Doctor: You don't have to inquire about the donor liver sources. If you want to do the surgery, then don't ask this kind of questions. If you really want to know, you can inquire outside physicians. Let them tell you.

Investigator: If you don't know the donors, and I'm supposed to have a liver transplant, can't I inquire about the donors? If not, how am I supposed to know whether the organ is healthy or not?

Doctor: You can't use the donated organ if it is not healthy. Otherwise wouldn't that be harming you?

Investigator: Ok. Another thing, are the donors usually young people? Where do these donated organs come from? Do they come from prisons or from courts?

Doctor: I can't answer your question. If you really want to do the transplant surgery, you may call the number I gave you to consult. Ok?

Investigator: Ok. Let me try this number one more time. Nobody answered last time when I called. Ok, thank you!

Doctor: Ok, good.
