Summary

1. As long as a matching organ can be found, a liver transplant can be done before the end of this year.
2. “(We do) quite a lot (of liver transplants)! We basically do it every day. We did it two days ago, and we are doing it again these days! (We’ve done) about several dozen cases (this year so far).”
3. “We do mainly kidney transplants. 300 cases have been done already this year!”

Phone Investigation Recording

Investigator: Hi, hello, hello!

Nurse: Hello!

Investigator: Is that the Renmin Hospital of Wuhan University?

Nurse: Yes. Tell me (what you want)!

Investigator: I have a friend...

Nurse: Yeah.

Investigator: Eh, he has to have a liver transplant. Do you do it here? Liver Transplant?

Nurse: Yes, we do! But we have to find a match first, then we can do it.

Investigator: Oh! If he comes for a match, I mean if you find a match, are you able to do it this year?

Nurse: Yes, we can.

Investigator: Oh! You can do it this year! So we...

Nurse: As long as there is a match, it can be done. That’s right.

Investigator: Oh! As long as a match can be found, it can be done this year?

Nurse: Right!

Investigator: So in this hospital, now in terms of waiting, are there many people waiting to do (the transplant)? Are there many people waiting in line?

Nurse: About that, it is not bad! Wait a minute, let me find a doctor to talk to you! Wait a minute!

Investigator: Oh! I just want to ask you a few simple questions first. Have you done many cases of (transplantation), such as this kind of liver transplants?

Nurse: Hmm. Quite a lot! We basically do it every day. We did it two days ago, and we are doing it again these days!

Investigator: Let's say that you have been doing this for almost a year now, have you done... about 100 cases?

Nurse: We mainly do kidney transplants here. (The number of liver transplants) is not that many, not as many as 100 cases. We have done 300 cases of kidney transplants... 300!

Investigator: 300 cases. Do you mean that is during this year, or it was from last year?

Nurse: We do mainly kidney transplants, and liver transplants are not as many.

Investigator: You said that 300 cases of kidney transplants have been done?

Nurse: That's right!

Investigator: Do you mean that 300 cases of kidney transplants have been done within this year? Or do you mean that was in the past years?

Nurse: It is definitely this year! 300 cases have been done already!

Investigator: Oh! You've done it this year, so you have done a lot of kidney transplants.

He needs to have a liver transplant. Have you done 100 liver transplants yet this year?

Nurse: No. Most likely...about several dozen cases!

Investigator: Several dozen cases. You have done dozens of cases. That means that every week you do this kind of liver transplants.

Nurse: Basically, it depends on the donors. If there are more donors, we can do more.

Investigator: Oh! Like that.

Nurse: We have to have donors, you know?

Investigator: Then recently, you just said that you had been doing (the transplants) in the past two days?

(A doctor took over the phone.)

Doctor: Hello!

Investigator: Hello! Is that a doctor?

Doctor: Yeah.

Investigator: Hey, I have a friend, who wants to have a liver transplant! I want to ask if you do liver transplants or not?

Doctor: Who is he? Is he a patient?

Investigator: What?

Doctor: Where is he from? Where does he come from?

Investigator: He is from Wuhan.

Doctor: Since he is in Wuhan, just come over for a consultation! Come to the ward to get a consultation. In any situation, just consult at the ward. You cannot talk about this clearly over the phone.

Investigator: He... his home...

Doctor: Okay!? That's it.
